In 2015:

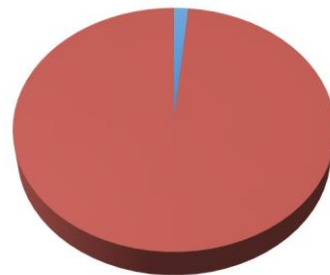
Which major literary magazine published **188 women** and **188 men**?

Which major monthly magazine reviewed the books of **21 women** and **50 men**?

Which national periodical moved toward gender parity by **18 percentage** points this year?

“VIDA is here to help shape the discussion,” we announced in 2010. Since then, VIDA has **sought to deepen and complicate the conversation about imbalances** in the way women and men are represented in major literary publications by performing an annual VIDA Count of journals, magazines and book reviews.

Now, this year, the VIDA Count will include numbers on race/ethnicity, gender, sexuality, and disability. **VIDA strives to spark public conversation about the intersection of gender, race, sexuality, and disability**, and how these identities affect the way writers are **perceived**, and therefore **received**, by the publishing world. We hope to be able to count more categories in future years.
